

Acw Rowing Scholarship 2022





Aon and Rowing NZ are looking to invest in up to two scholarships each year to support young rowers who may otherwise not be able to continue rowing to have the opportunity to progress their journey in rowing and through this opportunity realise their aspirations on the water and in life.

ELIGIBILITY

Applicants must satisfy the following criteria:



be in their final year of secondary school in 2021

U19/20

be rowing at age group level (U19 or U21) in 2022



have written endorsement from their school of the application



be planning to continue study (tertiary education) and/or an apprenticeship in 2022



CONTEXT



Aon and New Zealand Rowing are looking to support two young people, one female and one male, for a one-year period i.e. January 2022 to December 2022

The support provided will be specific to the successful applicant(s) needs and could include:



financial support



🎾 equipment support



study and career support



personal mentorship



coaching with high performance coach



a nutrition, psychology or strength and conditioning session

The scholarship has a financial value of up to \$4,000 per recipient. This will be a mix of financial assistance and in-kind support.

APPLICATION PROCESS

Applications must:

be submitted via the online application process outlined in the application form

be made by the applicant for this scholarship (i.e. not on behalf of)

be received no later than 5pm on Friday 26 November 2021



continue to row at University or Club in the year of this scholarship (2022).

RECIPIENTS

- ✓ look for opportunities to continue your growth and development on and off the water
- ✓ to forward a six-month and end-of scholarship report to Rowing NZ.
- ✓ The Aon Scholarship funding attracts GST. GST and income tax obligations are the responsibility of the Aon Scholarship recipient.

Applications must include:

completion of the 'Aon Rowing Scholarship Application Form'

a written endorsement from the applicant's school (signed by the school Principal/ Headmaster)

a covering letter, *written by the applicant*, using the following headings:

a summary of the applicants rowing journey thus far:

what your personal/social/academic/ qualification growth focus will be for 2022;

how you see this scholarship impacting on other areas of your life i.e. education or career training;

any reflections you have (positive and how they could be improved) on your Aon Maadi Cup experiences while at secondary school.



- a selection panel including representatives of Aon and Rowing NZ will review all applications.
- potential recipients will be short-listed and interviews scheduled as required.
- the Chief Executive of Rowing NZ will notify the successful applicants and all unsuccessful applicants will be advised.



Aon and Rowing NZ will jointly announce the scholarship recipients

Aon and Rowing NZ will be able to publish images and details of the recipient journey in 2022



ROWING SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION 2022

This scholarship is aimed at developing the whole athlete. The understanding is that talent, hard work and character development are all important elements of reaching sporting excellence. Students in their final year of secondary school who is going to continue rowing after leaving school and continue with their study or learning a trade should consider this scholarship.

Application Checklist

Does your application include:

The completed application form

A written endorsement from your school Principal or Headmaster

A covering letter, written by the applicant, that covers the following detail

Recaps on your rowing journey thus far

What your personal/social/academic growth focus will be for the scholarship year

How you think this scholarship will impact on other areas of your life, especially after you leave school

Any reflections you have (positive and how they could have been improved) on your Aon Maadi Cup experiences so far

Expectations of successful candidates:

- Will enrol in a tertiary education programme or an apprenticeship in 2022.
- ${\boldsymbol \cdot}$ Will be rowing regularly for a club or University in 2022.
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ Will submit reports to Rowing NZ as required.

The Scholarship will be reviewed if any of the above conditions are not met. This will be at the discretion of the Chief Executive of Rowing NZ.

Termination of Scholarship:

- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ If the recipient withdraws from Rowing or their tertiary programme.
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ If the recipient fails to meet any other agreed conditions of the scholarship
- If the student fails to meet expectations, the student will have the opportunity to address concerns through a restorative process with the Chief Executive of Rowing NZ or their delegated authority

Selection Process:

- A selection panel consisting of the Chief Executive of Rowing NZ and an appointed representative of Aon will review all applications.
- Potential scholarship candidates will then be shortlisted.
- · Interviews will be scheduled.
- Families and scholarship applicants will be required to attend an interview.
- The Chief Executive of Rowing NZ will notify successful applicants and all unsuccessful applicants will be notified before date of 17 December 2021.
