Annual Report

Whanganui wanted it noted there were inconsistencies in the annual report regarding how Whanganui is correctly spelt.

Financial Statements: Audit, Finance, Risk and Compliance Committee Report

Gerry Dwyer (Chairman of RNZ) spoke to the Financial Statement for the year ending 31 December 2021. The Auditors have not yet provided the audit report. The accounts had been approved by the board and KPMG provided a clean audit. A subsequent event has emerged after the audit regarding the treatment of a substantial under-spend of High-Performance Sport New Zealand (HPSNZ) investment in 2020 and 2021. While in the past under-spend has been bought forward in the accounts as reserves, HPSNZ have not yet advised NZRA of how the 2020 and 2021 underspend will be treated. Because HPSNZ have the ability to ask for the under-spend to be repaid, the auditors are seeking evidence of NZRA ability to retain those funds prior to issuing the audit report. That decision will be made by the HPSNZ on or before the 9th of June 2022.

The NZRA Board considers it appropriate for the annual meeting to note receipt of the signed accounts (without audit report) and when HPSNZ advises their decision, and that decision is reflected in the signed audited accounts, a Special General Meeting (SGM) be convened for the local Associations to approve the final audited accounts.

In discussion, it was noted that the only variation possible to the accounts as presented would be the treatment of the HPSNZ underspend in the balance sheet. It was considered the only reason to hold a SGM would be if there was a material change to the financial statements as presented.

Moved: That all non-financial reports in the 135th Annual Report and Financial Statements for the

year ending 31 December 2021 be received.

15. Appointments to the Board

The NZRA Board is seeking endorsement of three appointments:

- a. Following the retirement of Geoff Taylor in October 2021, Karen Raitt was appointed director and the NZRA Board is seeking endorsement for the remainder of Geoff Taylor's tenure to May 2023.
- b. Following the retirement of Hayden Dillon and the end of Virginia Le Bas three-year tenure the Board is seeking the appointment of Virginia Le Bas and Thornton Williams for the three-year period to the completion of the AGM in May 2025.

and Thornton Williams to May 2025 to the NZRA Board.

16. Election of Auditor

KPMG was appointed the Association's auditor in 2021 and has indicated its preparedness to continue to serve. The Board proposes that KPMG be re-appointed for another year.

Rob Hart has indicated his willingness to continue to serve as the Association's Legal Counsel and the Board proposes that Rob Hart be appointed for the next 12-month period.

The Wellington delegates suggested that when the NZRA Constitution was reviewed, as required to align with changes in the Incorporated Societies Act, that consideration be given to having the appointment of Auditor and Legal Counsel become the responsibility of the NZRA Board.

18. NZRA Levies

a) Association Levies

A recommendation was made by the NZRA Board that Association levies be set for the 2023 financial year at the 2022 levels - \$250 plus GST

Moved: That the Association levies for 2023 be set at \$250 plus GST

Auckland / Otago CARRIED

b) Subscriptions

A recommendation was made by the NZRA Board for 2023 that the annual Competition License Fee be set at \$85 plus GST (an increase of \$5 from 2022) and the Seat Levy be set at the same level as 2022, \$1.00 plus GST.

There was discussion led by Auckland, Waikato and Otago on the level of increase for the competition license fee and what benefit the rowing community would receive from any increase. The RNZ Board Chair confirmed the commitment made in the pre-AGM forum that the revenue generated by the increase in competition license fee would go directly to increasing the staffing capacity at RNZ to support community rowing.

Canterbury delegates raised the concern there was an inequity in contribution to RNZ revenue from across the rowing community. Some forms of rowing were looking to receive support from RNZ but were not contributing to revenue gathering. RNZ needed to consider alternative ways of 'widening the net' in gathering funding.

Whanganui asked about the cost of producing the magazine (OarSport) and whether that budget could be better spent. RNZ management undertook to consider the transitioning from paper to digital for communications such as the magazine and annual report.

Moved: That for 2023 the Competition License Fee be set at \$90 plus GST and Seat Levy be set at \$1

plus GST.

17. Allocation of the 2024 New Zealand Rowing Championships

Application has been received from Karāpiro Rowing Incorporated to host the 2024 New Zealand Rowing Championships at Lake Karāpiro from Tuesday 12 February to Saturday 18 February with Sunday 19 February being a spare day.

Championship and Non-Championship Event fees for the 2024 New Zealand Rowing Championships will be confirmed at the 2023 NZRA AGM.

Moved: That the application by Karāpiro Rowing Incorporated to host the 2024 New Zealand

Rowing Championships be approved

18. Confirmation of fees for the 2023 New Zealand Rowing Championships

The venue of the 2023 New Zealand Rowing Championships was confirmed as Lake Ruataniwha by the 2021 NZRA annual meeting.

Application has been received from South Island Rowing (SIR) for the event fees at the 2023 Championships as follows:

Auckland asked if any delegates could explain why SIR had removed a number of fees including late scratching and non-progression fees Canterbury responded that it reflected how circumstances had

evolved since those fees were introduced and SIR no longer feels they were justified.

19. Allocation of the 2023 New Zealand Masters Rowing Championships

Previous annual meetings had discussed confirming the dates of the master's Rowing Championships further in advance. 2022 is confirmed for 17 – 18 September 2022 at Lake Karāpiro. South Island Rowing has expressed interest in hosting the 2023 Masters Rowing Championships.

Moved: That the application by South Island Rowing to host the 2023 New Zealand Masters Rowing

Championships on the 16th and 17th September be accepted.

NZRA Service Awards; NZRA Volunteer Recognition and Club of the Year and other awards will be presented at the AGM dinner to be hosted by the Marlborough Rowing Association at the Boathouse Restaurant later in the evening.

21. Classification According to Ability Review

Andrew Carr-Smith advised the meeting the Board Classification Committee had convened and had made no recommendations to the RNZ Board.

Andrew outlined that the last few years had been an uncertain period due to Covid-19 disruption so no change was appropriate but there is opportunity going forward and the committee will be seeking Association input.

22. General Business

Gerry Dwyer (Chair of the RNZ Board) advised the meeting that the discussion in the pre-AGM forum would be documented and circulated to Associations and Affiliates.

The meeting Chair, Ivan Sutherland, acknowledged that three Board members (Gerry Dwyer, Hayden Dillon, and Raechel Cummins) were stepping down from the Board. The Board had made a presentation the evening before to Hayden and, with Raechel being an apology at the annual meeting, the Board would acknowledge her at a late date.

Today the meeting acknowledged the significant contribution of Gerry Dwyer for many years, the last nine as Chairman of the RNZ Board.

23. Adjournment of meeting to annual Dinner.

The meeting deferred to 6.30pm at the Awards Dinner.
